1. Boston Duck Tour

Tour admission

Duration: Approximately 1.5 hours.

Reservations: There are two easy ways to book a tour:

1. By phone: up to 30 days in advance at (617) 450-0068 (subject to a booking fee per person; see below). Prudential Center departures: \$5.00 booking fee per person. New England Aquarium departures: \$5.00 booking fee per person. Museum of Science departures: SPECIAL! Only a \$1.00 booking fee per person!

2. In person: at the departure locations (same day bookings only; no fee). If booking your tour in advance by phone, your credit card will be charged the full retail rate of the tour, plus the applicable booking fee per person (as noted above).

When you have presented your valid Go Boston pass at the departure point, your credit card will be reimbursed in full, less the booking fee (you do not need to have your credit card with you). All bookings are non-refundable and non-exchangeable.

Getting In: Prudential Center Kiosk: The Boston Duck Tour ticket booth is located outside the Shaw's Supermarket near the Prudential Center. Present your pass to any ticket agent. New England Aquarium (1 Central Wharf): Present your pass at the booth located outside of the New England Aquarium. Museum of Science: Present your pass at the wagon located outside of the Museum of Science main plaza.

Notes: Children under the age of 3 who do not have a Go Boston pass will be required to pay for admission to the Boston Duck Tours directly. As of this printing, the "under 3" rate is \$10.50, but is subject to change. Tip: Tours sell out early during the summer season. We suggest that you arrive early in the day to make any same-day reservations.

Getting In: Present your pass to any ticket agent at The Boston Harbor Cruise (BHC) Ticket Center, located on Long Wharf, to the left of the New England Aquarium.

Notes: Please arrive at least 30 minutes prior to departure. Children under age 3 will be subject to an admission fee. Please note, Go Boston pass holders may enter this attraction until closing. Reservations are not required, but are suggested for weekends and holidays. Dates and times are subject to change.

3. Boston Red Sox Game Ticket (select games) plus Early Park Access

Attend a game at fabled Fenway Park with Early Park Access to the Bleachers and Big Concourse area for an unforgettable memory of the 2018 World Series Champions warming up for the big game!

Getting In: Present your valid Go Boston pass at the Fenway Park ticket window on the day of the game (advanced reservations will not be accepted). Tickets may be obtained inside the main ticket office on the corner of Jersey Street and Brookline Avenue starting at 10:00am until 90 minutes prior to the scheduled first pitch, pending availability. Beginning 90 minutes prior to the scheduled first pitch until one hour after first pitch, tickets can be obtained at the Gate E ticket sales windows, pending availability.

Notes: With Early Park Access, pass holders may enter Fenway Park up to 2.5 hours before first pitch via Gate C to watch batting practice and explore the Big Concourse (Green Monster area is excluded.)

Go Boston pass is valid for select games (Outfield Grandstand, Lower Bleachers, or Standing Room Only sections) and is subject to availability.

4. Blue Man Group

Admission ticket to a multi-sensory and interactive experience of the Blue Man Group show (limited view seating or better)

Duration: Approximately 1.5 hours.

Getting In: Your pass must be redeemed in person at the Charles Playhouse Box Office in order to obtain your seating assignment on the day of the show. For the best available seats, it is suggested to redeem your pass as early in the day as possible, but no later than 1.5 hours prior to performance time. Your pass will activate once your ticket is picked up and is valid for a Limited View seat but when possible, you may be upgraded based on availability. Seats are assigned on a first-come, first served basis at the time of redemption. All tickets are subject to availability.

All redemptions are final. Cannot be combined with any other offer. No phone reservations will be accepted.

Notes: No children under the age of 3 are allowed in the theater. Strobe lights are in use during the show. If you are sensitive to strobe lights, please let a staff member know when you arrive at the theater. Late arrivals will be seated at management discretion and there may be seating holds. General admission to a colonial landmark where the Boston Tea Party began.

Duration: Approximately 30 minutes.

Getting In: Present your pass at the ticket desk for entry.

Hours: April 1 – October 31: daily: 9:30am – 5:00pm. November 1 – March 31: daily: 10:00am – 4:00pm.

You will need to enter your individual Go Boston pass numbers as well as a credit card number to hold your reservation. The credit card will only be charged if you do not show up for the tour. Getting In: Skip the general ticketing line by presenting your pass at the Information Desk located inside the front doors of the Aquarium. They will scan your pass and give you a ticket for entry.

Notes: The Aquarium is wheelchair and stroller accessible.

Go Boston pass admission applies only to the New England Aquarium.

IMAX and Whale Watch tickets are available for an additional charge.

8. Boston Children’s Museum

General admission to interactive science, history and culture exhibits geared to the younger set – this will be the highlight of your child’s visit to Boston!

Duration: Approximately 2 hours.

Getting In: Present your pass at the front desk for admission.

Notes: Children ages 12 months and older will need a pass for admission to the Museum.
Children without a pass will be charged the full \$17 retail admission.

Take the “T”: Red Line to South Station. Exit South Station and take a right onto Summer St., walking one block towards the water. Take the first left on Dorchester Ave.
Follow one block and turn right over the Congress Street Bridge. At the stoplight, turn right onto Congress St. and proceed across the bridge. You’ll see the Museum ahead, behind the 40-foot milk bottle. Silver Line to Courthouse Station. Upon exiting, turn left (toward the City of Boston skyline). Walk straight down Seaport Blvd. Cross Sleeper St. and enter the Museum’s Children’s Wharf Park. Take a left onto the Boston Harborwalk along the Fort Point Channel to the Museum entrance.

9. Institute of Contemporary Art

Take the “T”: Silver Line to Courthouse stop. Exit the station onto Seaport Boulevard and follow it, walking away from downtown. Just before the first traffic light, there will be a pedestrian opening in the fence on your left – walk through it to the walkway that runs alongside the Chapel of Our Lady of Good Voyage. This will lead you to Northern Avenue. The ICA is across the street.

10. Same-Day Bike Rental by Urban AdvenTours

Same-day standard bike rental including helmet, lock and cable.

Duration: All day (return bikes by 6:00pm).

Getting In: Plan to arrive at least 30 minutes early to sign a waiver and get sized for a bike.

Notes: You may upgrade to an Electric Bike for an additional \$50.00 (payable directly to Urban AdvenTours). Your pass must be valid on the tour day. Alternatively, you may upgrade to the Boston City View Tour, Tour de Cambridge, or Tour de Boston Tour for an additional \$30.00 (payable directly to Urban AdvenTours). General admission to Paul Revere's colonial home during the time of the American Revolution.

Duration: Approximately 30 minutes.

Getting In: Present your pass at the ticket booth for entry.

Notes: Your pass is not valid for special programs, with the exception of the holiday celebration.

13. Museum of Science

Duration: Approximately 2 hours.

Getting In: SKIP THE LINE! at the Box Office and proceed straight to the desk adjacent to the turnstiles for entry. Present your admission pass for Exhibit Halls entry.

Notes: Separately ticketed exhibitions are not included. If you would like to purchase tickets for special exhibitions or venues not included with general Exhibit Halls admission (Mugar Omni Theater, Charles Hayden Planetarium, Butterfly Garden, Thrill Ride, or 4D Theater) please go to the Box Office for assistance. Ticket to ride on a Swan Boat on the beautiful Boston Public Garden pond – a treasured Boston tradition.

Duration: Approximately 30 minutes.

Getting In: Present your pass at the entry area.

15. Skywalk Observatory

Admission to Boston’s only sky-high vantage point for sweeping 360-degree views of Greater Boston and beyond.

Duration: Approximately 45 minutes.

Getting In: To access the Skywalk, enter through the Lower Lobby of the Prudential Center (800 Boylston Street) – look for the sign that says Skywalk in the Belvidere Arcade. Proceed down the escalator in front of the Prudential Tower, turn left and take the elevator to the 50th floor. Exit the elevator and present your pass at the ticket desk.

Notes: Please be advised that the Skywalk Observatory is also a banquet facility.
